

Weed Abatement Scope of Work

Work performed under this contract shall include, but is not limited to, cutting, and removing overgrown weeds, grass, scrub growth, and non-ornamental plant growth in excess of 12 inches in height (sometimes exceeding 3 feet), in violation of chapter 106 of the City of Dothan code of ordinances. Also removing junk, trash, litter, and debris which is on the area to be cut, and a hinderance to cutting the property cleanly. (Note: Any junk, debris, trash, or litter removed should be placed at the curbside/roadside, but at no time shall be placed in the street/roadway).

Contractors should expect to encounter the following conditions and situations:

- Non-billable “dry runs” in which you arrive at a work site to find the property already mowed
- Substantial quantities and thicknesses of overgrowth and debris
- Irrate property owners
- Up to 100 proceed to cut orders issued in a six (6) month period

Contractor shall own or have unlimited access to the tools and equipment required to perform this work. These items include, but are not limited to:

- Tractor and bush hog
- Commercial grade lawn mower
- Push mower
- Weed Eater
- Cutting tools for wild scrub growth

Lack of necessary equipment or equipment failure shall not be a valid reason for failure to complete work in a timely manner and shall be grounds to immediately terminate the agreement.

All work shall be performed on the parcel and all adjacent easements and right of ways including along streets and alleys.

Contractor shall bill the City upon completion of all work on a per parcel basis. Before and after photographs of the offending property are required to be submitted with the invoice. Acceptable digital photographs will show a clear view of the entire property.

Contractor shall charge for time spent on job site only. Travel time or labor costs incurred by the contractor above the price set by the city for the cutting of the property are not eligible charges. Contractor shall possess a valid City of Dothan Business License for the type of work to be performed. On properties less than one (1) acre, contractor shall commence all work within three (3) days of accepting the job and shall complete all work within five (5) days. On properties of one (1) acre or more, contractors shall begin the work withing three (3) days of accepting the job and complete all work within eight (8) days. Unless delayed by verifiable weather events, or other verifiable unforeseen events.
