WHEREAS, the Alabama Rural Coalition for the Homeless (ARCH) receives funding from the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program, which program is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and administered by the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA); and

WHEREAS, ESG funds are used to rehouse people, to help prevent evictions, and for emergency shelter; and

WHEREAS, the Southeast Alabama Coalition for the Homeless (SEACH) covers the seven county Wiregrass Region and is eligible to utilize ESG funding in Houston County; and

WHEREAS, the signature of the chief elected official in any entitlement city in the rural counties covered by ARCH must be filed with ADECA prior to the release of funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Dothan, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of Dothan is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Certification of Local Government Approval for Nonprofit Organizations receiving ESG Program Funds from ADECA, which said certification is attached to and made a part of this resolution.
